

- The city is 800 years old and situated on 14 islands
- Population in the municipality of Stockholm: 1 M
- Population in the Stockholm region: 2,4 M
- Population in Sweden: 10,5 M
- Population in the Nordic countries: 27 M


The Street Operation Unit





Organization: Operational work

- Streets: The Transport Department has overall responsibility for management, including acquisitions, contract negotiation and coordination
- 14 procured contracts from 2 private entrepreneurs
- **Parks:** 11 city district departments are responsible for a large part of the operations





Costs of cleanliness

Annual costs of cleanliness: Approx. 12,765 000 Euro (146 M SEK)

984 700 inhabitants in Stockholm **Cost per inhabitant:** Approx. 13 Euro


LEAF REMOVAL Completed in November

Waste bins

Bins in parks: 7,500 pieces Bins in streets: 5,600 pieces Total: 13,100 pieces

Total: 0,013 per inhabitant Total street: 0,0056 per inhabitant

Multistream bins – The Park Department operates 170 modules





A few examples of the 13,100 waste bins



Examples of requirements when purchasing

- Rain protected top
- Opens with key
- Scratch and illegal graffiti protection
- Pest proof
- Integrated ashtray

Solar compacting bins

- Solar powered with built-in press that compacts the waste
- Designed to make the collection process more efficient
- Easier to manage
- Sustainable by reducing the frequency of emptying





Sensors

- The sensor is attached to the inside of the waste bin
- It measures the amount of garbage
- Sends signals when the bin needs to be emptied
- The goal is to reduce both the number of transports and the use of plastic bags


To communicate about the climatesmart, growing city and about daily operations to ensure a clean, accessible, attractive, sustainable and safe city with green values.

During 2022 the Transport Department received about **253 095** comments, through the Tyck till app, email and telephone


